On behalf of the faculty, staff and administration I would like to wish you a glorious Easter. I pray you enjoy time with your family and rest. I am happy to announce that our new Spanish teacher, for the 2017-2018 school year, for grades 5-8 has been hired. (in my first announcement I indicated this position would only be Junior High but have since changed the plans to include 5th grade).

Mrs. Juanita Mendoza is coming to us from San Antonio with her husband and two children. She holds a degree in foreign language and a Texas teaching certificate.
